

Foundation Grants Awarded!

At its meeting held May 14 in Casper Wyoming, the Foundation Board approved the grants totaling \$127,500, as follows:

1. St. Andrews in the Pines (Pinedale), St. John the Baptist (Big Piney): *Karibu Grant* \$50,000

Once again a \$50,000 grant has been awarded to St. Andrews and St. John the Baptist to continue the good work with the Msalto Theological School and the Bishop Stanway Primary School in Mdomo Tanzania. This grant will assist in tuition of the young scholars, as well as supplies and equipment for the schools. 2. St George's (Lusk): *Continued Mustard Seed project* \$5,000

St. George will continue its Mustard Seed project of hosting community dinners for the benefit of other local civic and charitable organizations. 3. St. Luke's (Buffalo): *Food Pantry Freezer upgrade* \$22,500

St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Buffalo will continue its ecumenical food project: *The Bread of Life Food Pantry*. To assist in expanding the program, the Foundation award will be used to purchase and install a commercial size freezer. This will enable more donations of wild meat to be stored and distributed over time, while freeing up other space to be used for dry goods and food. 4. St Peter's (Sheridan): *Sanctuary of Hope Children's Orphanage, Kenya* \$50,000
